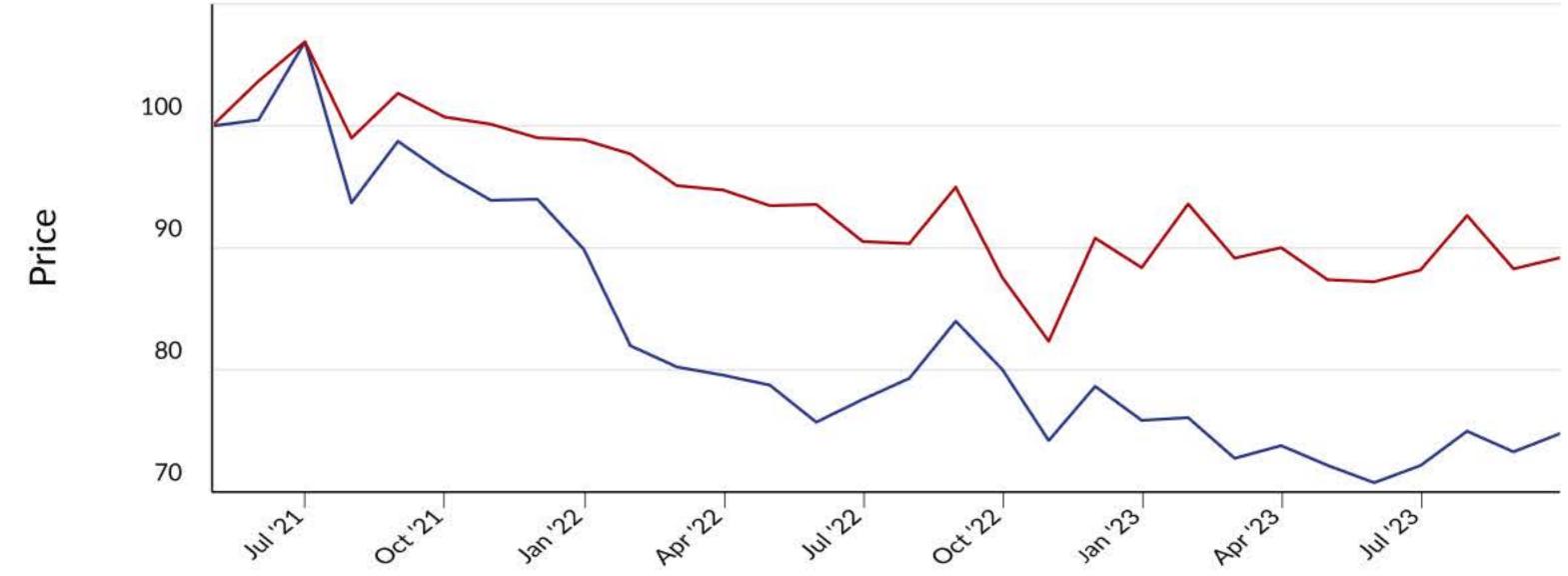

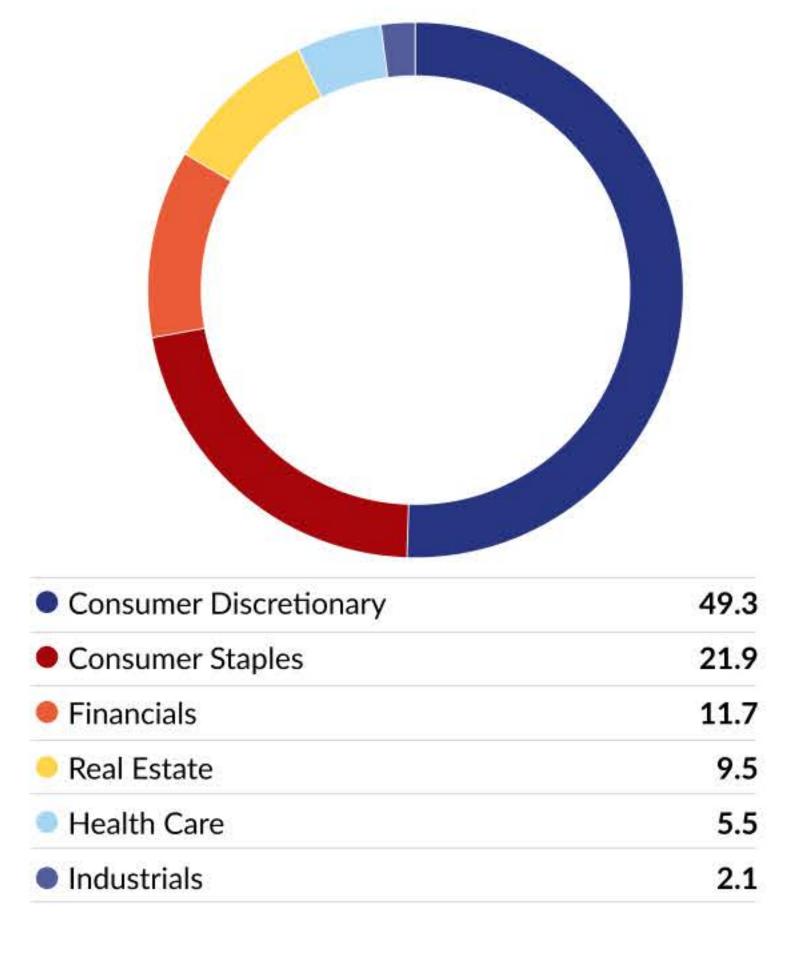

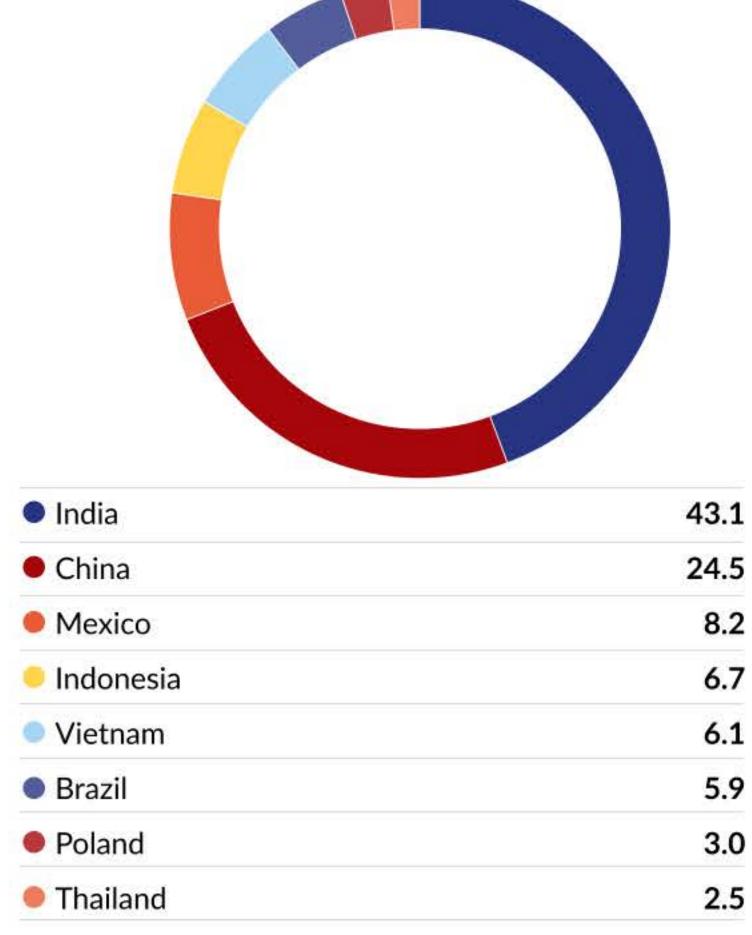

MANAGER'S COMMENTARY

World stock markets were under renewed pressure in September as the Federal Reserve indicated that US interest rates were likely to remain at their current levels for some time to come, causing the 10-year Treasury Bond yield to rise sharply. In addition, an OPEC supply cut which sent the oil price sharply higher, put additional pressure on equities. In these conditions the Fund often performs relatively well, as consumer plays suffer less than the larger cyclical stocks which dominate the index This proved to be the case in September with the Fund net asset value rising 2.0% while the MSCI Emerging Markets Index gained 1.0%.

Outperformance was largely generated by Our Indian holdings which continue to perform well. Despite initial worries that the higher oil price would keep inflation, and therefore interest rates at a higher level, Indian property stocks had a strong month. Macrotech Developers which is one of the largest residential developers in Mumbai rose 19.3% while DLF, focused on Delhi, gained 5.3%. Both stocks have risen by more than 40% so far this year. Two of the Fund's motor vehicle plays also performed well. TVS Motors (motorcycles), rose by 7.2% while Maruti Suzuki, (cars), ended the month 7.2% higher. Apollo Hospitals, Varun Beverages and Zomato were all around 5% higher, which in the context of a tough market was exceptionally helpful. There was little corporate news of any significance, and one portfolio change was made with the sale of HDFC Bank in favour of a holding in Bajaj Finance. Mostly due to technical reasons, the recent merger with its parent company HDFC Ltd has cast a shadow over HDFC Bank, while Bajaj, a leader in consumer finance, and a stock which we have successfully owned in the past, is growing faster and is a purer consumer play.

China continues to grind lower, beset by worries over the property market, a weakening currency, and diminishing foreign direct investment. All but one of the Fund's China holdings ended the month lower, although as with India, corporate news was almost non-existent. At month end the Fund had 24.5% of its assets committed to China, confined solely to ecommerce and services companies, as well as electric vehicle makers and travel and restaurants, all areas which on the basis of recent quarterly and interim results are faring well, and indeed, should benefit substantially if the economy, and sentiment improves.

Elsewhere, we met with mixed results. **Dino Polska** (Polish supermarkets), continued to decline following its results in August which revealed some margin pressure. Vietnam traded down, for no very clear reason, and both **Khang Dien House** and **Mobile World** ended the month 11.8% and 2.2% lower respectively. Our sole Thai holding, **Bumrungrad Hospital**, had another good month, rising 3.5% while hosting a very reassuring conference call. Mexico was weaker, and we used this weakness to start a holding in **Alsea** which is the franchisee for **Starbucks**, **Domino's Pizza**, and **Burger King** amongst others, and operates almost 3,000 quick service restaurants in 5 countries in Latin America. We expect it to grow earnings by over 25% next year, and in our view, the stock is attractively valued.

As we write, China is in the middle of a national holiday week, and doubtless, much ink and hot air will be expended analysing behavioural and consumption trends in the hope of spotting an improvement. We expect that the Fund's holdings are well positioned to take advantage of better times, should they arise. Meanwhile, we continue to believe that India represents an outstanding long term opportunity, with our portfolio of high quality market leading companies in a prime position to benefit from a rapidly improving economy.
